(Well, did you use to dance when you were little?)

Oh yeah--well, not when I was little.

(Well, when did you start in?)

Oh, when I was about 16 years old. When I was little, daddy don't let us dance.

(Why not?)

I don't know why. They don't supposed to. They didn't used to allow kids to dance and go around where there was dances. But, now there's nothin' but kids in dance grounds. Yeah, they all kinds of dances. That's where they have good dance--over here at Ed Macks. All different kinds. They'd dance day time. They wear feathers. They all dressed up pretty.

(What kind of dances did they do?)

They do all kinds. All different kinds.

(War dance?)
