(What happened if you didn't give em one?)

Mr.: Well, they'd, they could, stop you. You'd have trouble with em.

Mrs.: See they'd do that in order to let you go across the reservation.

Mr.: Across the resefvation.

(Did you ever have any trouble with em?)

Mr.: No, didn't have no trouble. If you treat an Indian like he's a human, you won't have no trouble. The worst tro ble that people is with the Indians is they didn't treat um like the was a human. You've got to treat any race of people. You take a Negro or any race of people. If you treat any race of people. You take and if you treat him like he is a human, you're not apt to have troble with em. But a lotta people come in here, sometimes they got out and sometimes they do bring whiskey in anda then they got the...then these Indians got to where they got to put them on the law forc and they catch these bootleggers and when they did if you didn't sell but half a pint, it was five years in the penitentiary. If you sold ten gallons, they give you five years. That's a plenty for bootleggin'. I knew one feller, got 20 years for sellin' whiskey at McAlester. It was his second or third tiem. Anda he was a barber. They called him Squirrel Johnson. (unclear) Anda he went to federal pen. I think three times. Last time they gave 'em (unclear) But these Indians out here, they come in here and sellum this whiskey and they get on the warpath. Anda there was quite a restriction on that. But they'd get drunk and rise up _____ Now Kiowas and Apaches. Apaches are ones of meanest Indians there is. It was mean tribe.

Mrs.: What about the Araproes? Was they pretty mean?

Mr.: No, the Aranches good Indians. The Cheyenne's mean Indian but the Apache was the meanest Indian. He was led by ole...I saw ole chief _____ If ou're ever In Cheyenne, Oklahoma, go there in that bank and you'll see ole Black Kettle's head. They killed him there in the Battle of the Washita. His skull's in there that bank there anda I been a right on that battleground there. You go a mile west of Cheyenne anda 'bout two miles north and you're right in on where they fought the Battle of the
