Mr.: Then they passed a law that if you married an Indian, You didn't git no headright. Now and you can marry all these ndians ~~and~~ you want to and you won't git no headright. And if that Indian squaw wanta will you some of that land when she dies, she can do that. If she don't, it'll go back to the tribe.

Mrs.: Well, ah...in my opinion...

Mr.: If she's got any kids...if she's got any kids, of course, the kids...

Mrs.: The Indians's didn't git any land after 1905. Any of 'em. Because a we had Indian, part Indiand and he was part Mexican lived close to us and ~~K&K~~ his two oldest children got land but the rest of 'em didn't git any 'cause...I've...

Mr.: They closed the rollin 1907.

Mrs.: '05 is the land tie. Cause Viola and Te ddy, bothe told me, 1905. They had...

Mr.: They'd close the roll, 1907. On different tribes...

Mrs.: They had some kids borned after that but they didn't git no land. Some of 'em got land up here around Chickasha. I don't know where the others got...Viols's, Teddy's, I believe, is up there around Chickasha. I don't know where the others got...Viola's was. Th t's a girl...girl and boy that was the two oldest ones. But now they got land. But the other's drawed a little money. And there's a white man here, that married an Indian woman, and I don't know but they must have six or seven children. And at one time here all drawed so much money. \$200 each, wudn't it? \$180, and he told by how much money he got off the government through those children. I believe \$180 because this woman that run a store that use to be over there. She had ne to take one of the checks that she had cashed. To take it to town and cash if fer her, she needed some money and she could't leave the store. \$180, each one of em. A \$180. So that's a pretty good little pile of money.
