No. These were concrete or brick buildings. They were banks- was brick buildings."
(What about the hotel?)
Wety, they were frame buildings. But I think there was one brick hotei. . But there wias threy six of 'em on that one street. "And reached half mile up to the delpot. Today, as far as I know, - I was down there-about six or seven years ago- came through that way - - and there was a $\underset{j}{j i l l i n g}$ station guy that keeps a little beads and stuff like that, fish bait hhings, little bit of groceries and there wasn't even a grocery store thate, So, two filling stattions, and here and there a little old field shack.
( Well, what didyou all do down there? Did you run another boarding house?) No. a -we', á my brother kept us,up see. And my mọthet just worked' you know, She'd sew for popple, and - or go stay with people, that was sick or somethin'. Most of the time we lived with my.grandma. See. Worked on"my grandma's farm. But we'd go back down there to go to school, 'cause wefdidn't have to.buy our books, down there. We had to buy them in Oklahoina. See, Texas had free books since 1916, and we didn't have to buy them: Did you say there was a. lot of Indians that made mones (in. these qil fields?)
There 'was here, some "of lene But the way they made it; they made it out of the land they had. Now the Indians that had an education - that had the opportunity to, you know, they was lucky enơugh they went to school now they did make it big... Now take that man I mentioned here or other - 'I didn! t. know id he died or if somethin' happened to him - named Kitchens. Now they did good, and they a- op, Frank Big Doctor and Little Doctor- - their
