where that man get those potatoes out. Well, when he turn around, he kinda missed some of 'em. Didn't get all of 'em. So this other fellow--some other fellows, I guess--I don't know how many--and after work time, they dig those and put 'em in a sacks and they go sell 'em. And they come to where he was working, and they sold lots of potatoes and he bought some. We had lottsa potatoes. We brought them home, what he bought.

(Were they pretty good?)

Yeah, they were good ones. And them what I got, I been cooking 'em, you know. Being cut, when they was getting 'em out. They cut some of 'em off, you know.

(You said, also, I think that you buy your pumpkins now that your gonna dry?)
Yeah, I always buy the pumpkins, right now. Two, three, four. And then
ah it lasts me all winter long. Jest for our family, you know.

(Are they very big?)

I buy any size, I like to, you know--big or just a little small one.

(What kind do you like to get? I noticed that there's lotta different sizes and shapes of pumpkins. Some of them are big and sorta squatty like and then some of them are sorta long and narrow.)

Those narrow ones, they kinda brownish look in. Not the what-cha-callit-pie, pumpkin, ah pumpkin pie...

(Pie Pumpkin.)

... Umhumm, not that kind. It's them other kinds:

(That you like?)

Umhumm.

(Well did the Indians have their own kind, way back when you were a girl?)
Umhumm. Well, Indians have their own pumpkin. There not like that. They
