BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

Dee Brown was born December 17, 1884. He is still very active and alert and is able to ride horses every day. He came to this country in 1902 from Eastern County, Texas. Mr. Brown has been a cattle and horse buyer since he was a young man. He has lived in the area of Mountain View since 1912. He has leased Indian land for many years and has many friends among the Indians of that area. One of his neighbors was Big Bow, father of Able Big Bow.
