

Mr. E.: Mrs. Bylander, are you from the records of the Delaware County Welfare Department?

Mrs. E.: Yes sir.

Mr. E.: You personally prepared this?

Mrs. E.: Yes sir.

Reference: As a representative of the County Department.

Mrs. E.: Yes.

Mr. E.: I wondered if she wanted to tell me why.

Mrs. E.: Why?

Mr. E.: Yes, I wondered; I thought there was something (not clear) when I asked you. In the 1, 2, 3, 4, 5th, 6th paragraph, the 1, 2, 3rd sentence says: "the last extension was from 5-60 to 5-70, the next sentence says in each time in the granting an extension, it would state the extension was granted unless the land sale which his property could be offered for sale occurred prior to the 12 month period. I don't want to be technical but those lines are uninterpretable in the way that they appear on this piece of paper, I'll object to their being unintelligible unless you care to state what was being said there.

Mrs. E.: Well, he was given 12 months each time, extension would be granted each time. During the 12 months if the land sales came up and there was an acceptable bid, he was to sell his land, dispose of his land at that time and this last time, no sale came up during May which was the beginning of this period.

Mr. E.: So what it should contain is something to the effect it would say that this land sale contained an acceptable bid, right?

Mrs. E.: Yes.

Mr. E.: And further, in reference to an extension, it said, in each time the notice of extension, it would state...now, who is that notice from and who is it to?

Mrs. E.: It is from the State Office and it is to us granting an extension.

Mr. E.: It isn't an; a notice to Mr. O'Field?

Mrs. E.: No.

Mr. E.: And under these sentences here, if an acceptable land sale offer, bid very low during the first land sale during the 12 month period the meaning of this... his extension would continue unless that happened? Is that it?

Mrs. E.: Unless it was an adequate bid.

Mr. E.: So if he did receive this sort of bid you referred to the termination would automatically?

Reference: This is a piece that is probably paraphrased from the department's manual?

Mrs. E.: Yes.

Reference: It might be of value to obtain that particular section of the manual and read that into the record to help clarify the issue.
