

acre or \$150 an acre, or \$118 an acre and yet the bid received on Mr. O'Fields property of \$6400 for 182 acres is less than \$36 an acre. And the total effect of these three pages sent by the Bureau contradicts their statement that the bid received is an acceptable one. Without knowing what their standards are for acceptable, its difficult to argue with them but their absence here makes it; I think on the face of it an unreasonable and arbitrary evaluation or acceptable bid.

We're ready to call our witnesses. Is Mr. O'Field sworn?

Referee: No.

Mr. T.: I want to call him first.

Referee: Mr. Trepp desires at this time to present witnesses and has desired to call Mr. O'Field first and in the beginning we agreed that witnesses would be sworn in as they appear with the exception of Mrs. Evinger and Mr. Dunaway who were sworn in earlier and are still under oath. If then, Mr. O'Field, you will raise your right hand I'll administer the oath at this time.
