

Mr. T.: Do you know them by their Cherokee Name?

Mr. O.: Yes sir.

Mr. T.: At one time, I don't have the date of that application Form BC-5, or what ever it is was signed, what's the date on that?

Mrs. E.: There's no date on this form; it is recorded by the narrative the date he signed it. Would you like to have that?

Mr. T.: Yes.

Mrs. E.: This is from the narrative section, page 28 and the last date was 11-4-65 and said ABCD-54 signed by Mr. O'Field.

Mr. T.: Thank you, May I have that one signed?

Mr. O'Field, this is the ABCD-54 form of the Oklahoma Department of Welfare, is 5-15-51 titled STATEMENT OF INTENTION REGARDING RESTRICTED INDIAN PROPERTY. And it says:

I hereby record my intention to request the U. S. Indian Service to make available for my use such values as there may be in restricted Indian Property which I hold or in which I have an equity. This request will be based on my need for this resource for maintenance or other use within the standards of the Department of Public Welfare to which I am now making application for assistance.

And I believe the records show it was signed in November 1965?

Referee: November 4, 1965 I believe was the date.

Mr. T.: Just roughly, November. Is that your signature on that sheet of paper?

Mr. O.: Yes sir.

Mr. T.: Do you remember the circumstances under which it was signed?

Mr. O.: No, I don't think I fully understood it, when I signed it.

Mr. T.: Do you remember where it was signed and who was there and so forth?

Mr. O.: Well, I don't remember who was there but I couldn't call her name.

Mr. T.: Was it at your house?

Mr. O.: I believe it was. Best I can remember.

Mr. T.: Do you remember anyone else who was present when you signed it?

Mr. O.: No, I don't.

Mr. T.: At that time, what was your income at the time that you signed that paper?

Mr. O.: You mean the children's assistance and so on, I didn't have any income myself the children had \$174.

Mr. T.: In 1965 your children were getting \$164?
