

rs. P.: Yes.

r. T.: Is she here?

rs. P.: No.

r. T.: Do you know anything about the sale of that land? Do you know anything about it, anything that happened about the sale of it?

rs. P.: He said as far as he knew, well Carl Cooper was wanting to buy that land and she said alright and then he must of worked the rest of the details out, wrote to the BIA to remove the restrictions and that was as far as he knew. He offered I think \$25,000 for it but BIA okayed the \$5,500. It was \$2,500 instead of \$25,000.

r. T.: Do you know anything about the building of a house on this land? Do you know any about any talk about building a house on that land?

rs. P.: Snarolet was to buy the land that Dan's father left and to build a house on that land. He said thats the only thing he knows about it.

r. T.: With the money she got from the sale of this land she was going to buy another...

rs. P.: Yes.

r. T.: Did she buy it?

rs. P.: No.

r. T.: Why didn't she buy it?

rs. P.: They brought her, I don't know, he didn't say, blue-prints of houses and she picked out the one that she wanted and then she told them that Dan would build the house for her and thats whenever they said that they had their own builders and thats why she wouldn't buy the land, they wouldn't let Dan build it for her.

r. T.: He doesn't know who the "they" were?

rs. P.: Some BIA, builders from the BIA. They said they had their own builders and she wanted Dan to. The house and the land would have taken all her money but if she had built it, she would have saved a little money there.
