Mr. T.: At one time did you have tax exempt and restricted land that was allotted to you out of the Cherokee Nations?

Mrs. P.: Yes he did.

Mr. T.: Do you have it now?

Mrs. P.: No he doesn't. Not any of it.

Mr. T.: How many acres did you have in 1965 of that allotment?

Mrs. P.: At that time he had 105 acres.

Mr. T.: How much did you have originally? At the beginning?

Mrs. P.: That was all he had. 105 acres.

Mr. T.: And what happened to that 105 acres, was it all sold at one time?

Mrs. P.: The first land he sold was 60 acres.

Mr. T.: When did he sell that?

Mrs. P.: He doesn't remember exactly when, but he thinks it was about 2 years ago.

Mr. T.: and he sold 60 acres first; how did that sale happen?

Mrs. P.: It was the Bureau of Indian Affairs told him that it was better if he sold his land and his assistance would be continued,

Mr. T.: And that is when he sold the 60 acres?

Mrs. P.: Yes.

Mr. T.: How much money did you receive for that?

Mrs. P.: \$360.

Mr. T.: For 60 acres. And that left him with how much?

Mrs. P.: 45 acres he thinks was left.

Mr. T.: Did he get the money, the \$360 for that land that he sold?

Mrs. P.: He didn't get it all at one time, he just get a little at a time.

Mr. T.: How much did he get?

Mrs. P.: Just whatever he wanted, sometimes \$10, \$20, \$25.

Mr. T.: Is that a month or what?

Mrs. P.: Just any time he wanted it.

Mr. T.: Was he then on; was he getting Public Assistance after he sold that land? For Welfare?
