MARY POAFFYBITTY'S RELATIVES:

(You said that you had some relatives up in Canton, Watonga, Geary?

Who are they?)

Oh, it's just Sankes. Sankes. My uncles son, he's my nephew. Cause my grandmother was Arapaho. Her father was Arapaho, and her mother was Arapaho. Arapaho folks up there, and you know, half Arapaho.

(What is your nephew's name?)

He died. Sanke. Robert Sanke.

(He's dead?)

Yes, he's dead.

(You had a uncle you said up there, is he alive?)

Yeah, he's alive. He's about 85 years old. We went there last--other day and seen him.

(What's his name?)

Jesse Row Lodge. He's going to give me a book. This book--that's what I went after, you know, to tell you about the tribe--our tribes--in Arapaho tribe. That's ours. That was wrote by--there was a book what he told, I guess, long time ago, and he had a book, and Washinton asked for it and he send it up there and I wanted that book. When I
