They all went army too.

(All went to the army?)

All the Company died. All dead.

(Your Company all died?)

Oh, yes mom! Shore did! All dead. That gas they said, they just couldn't stand it. Germany just gas--put in gas I think. Choctaw Indian can't stand that gas. (not clear) breathing and (not clear). Yeah, they died-- all come back dead. All dead. Just me, but we didn't go in there. They wouldn't let us go in there. They going to make peace--talk. They did.
