EXPERIENCES WITH INDIA'S:

MY experiences in teaching has been from 1916 to 1967. 21 years of it in Seminole Sounty, Oklahoma. The last eighteenyears-18 & years, Carnegie, Oklahoma -- in the middle of the Niowa Indian area. Our student Indian proportions about 3% and 1 find the Miowa Indian is very intelligent. And capable of doing good academic work. But, because of his primitive background and social lifehe is inclined to become native in the years, about the sophomore or junior year, but there are few expeptions which make the work well worth while. And those exceptions are the exceptional students who continue their work regardless of their background and handicaps and generally make good in whatever field they take part, especially the atheletic field in education and the theletic fields in various spots. out, on the -- the Indian is not responsive to oral resitation. He hestitates to express himself in the pressence of teacher and white students. And he dislikes to in ergrate with them. If you'll permit the, they'll sit in the corner, as far back in the, room as possible, but if you give them written assignment, we find that they do exceptionally well, a ven compared to the white areas, white people students. They, Kiowa indian is of large physical indian and most of them are exceptionally well, even atheletic material for in toth boys and firls sports lieds and sit's in thes fields we've been able to reach them and ret more, ongtructive work than the academic fields. However that doesn't mean that they can dot do the academic work, becaus of their parkground and their handidars of their race.

Into. I think the -we are encouraging that somewhat and encouraging the indian to retain much of his social customs and religion and in the form of fow-w was and other celebrations -- costume and so forth and it makes it more difficult for him to pick up the white man's way of living and we encourage him in him war dancing, not that it is well worth their retaining but, it's a henderence to the Indian himself. In our experience with him on the basketball floor and
