what they do you know. That's kind of an Indian way of doctoring too. Any-body that sick or weak, take them in there and heat it up like that and give, a sweat bath. Take hot baths that's what they do. They doctor them like that.

USE OF SAGE WITH PEYOTE,

(Indians -- do you use sage sometimes?)

What we use in our peyote they keep them so long you know, and scatter them all around inside tipi and you put that quilt over it, sit on it and wait. At the start of the meeting they have along this tea. And you pass it on and you take a little piece of it. Put it in your mouth and chew it and then swish it like that. That is before everything starts. And pass it like that. And keep passing it on until it come back to you and then they use and then they pass it, smoke you know, everybody smoke. And then it comes back to the chief and then by his signal, everybody, you know. Prays to it before he start.

(You were telling me that when you doctor somebody you chew that medicine, you boil that?)

Uh-huh.

(What kind of medicine do you do that with?)

One up there we going to get.

(Now this is the small fone?)

Uh-hum that one. I use that, it's for--you/know it's for doctor with. That's what we use it. The name of it is wild medicine, what they use.

(Is there a difference between persons who use medicine and a person who has all other kinds?)

Um→hum.

(Are they, can you give names in Indian medicine?)
