mutual help. He said, it seems the hole United States got their eyes on you. If that starts, and should become something the people would be proud of, he said, that's gonna be one awakening the Cherokee's or any other Indians, is gonna see with their own naked eye, that there is something to all this talk but until then, that's the reason these Indians here, are so anxious for these buildings to come up. And see how they're gonna work, when are they gonna start, every day they're asking questions.

They wanta see, they want results from all these talks, that's right.

(They've listened long enough.)

(It's been a real enjoyable evening Calvin, and I thank you for your remarks we've had here today, do you have anything else you want to comment?)

No, if, that's all I can say is—I've been asked at these Indian education meetings what I thought of them, and what the rest of the people thought of them, but now, that's they are all right.

Threre's a few people yet that's against it, but they really don't know. Some of 'em never attended one of 'em.

(Some of 'em are gonna be against anything won't they?)
