And just like Sally and I would say that time when al! that confusion was going on--Sally would say, "My, just think--that one staff--remember? We used to put it from corner to corner, just like that. And now it's really causing a lot of confusion. And that one, it had a little iron--what would you call it?--spear at the end of it. And that's the one my boy first danced with--the one that's in California. And after he left for California, Amos used that staff to dance with. Now that piece come off and he (Amos) never did return it. We've been after him and he never did return it to this day. He never did return: that little iron piece

Evelyn: It was a little iron made into a spear. (point) .It's sharp-pointed.

Alfred: Didn't it come off a lightning rod?

Evelyn: I don't know where it came from, but it was on there.

Affred: It come off a lightning rod.

Evelyn: So we just recovered that, you know.
