And so, therefore, we was lucky. But, anyway, somebody told it around that this merchant, he was out there, wasn't in town, he was out in kind of the country and lived on a section, you know, where our roads come together. And you know, they were gonna not get it, and there was a mad school teacher named Mr. Merchant that he lived at there not far from there. And he went by his car to that store and he got that sack of flour and he told them people that there he'd best shoot him if they come in there, and do anything to that flour. Because, actually he really did you know, when they finally had an investigation, he wasn't a party of doing anything like that.
