words, well, they're singing the words. I'll just give you the interpretation of what they call this boy—a name. That he done a wonderful job, wonderful words. He done something wonderful. And he charged the enemy and when he charged the enemy, the enemy fired into him, and he done a wonderful job by killing the enemy and scalping him and coming back victorious. And here he didn't fall when the guns went off, but he come back victory. That's what the words say. They come out any way, they just sing. (Could you sing that one?)

Maybe Josephine will sing it to you. (talks to another woman but she won't sing) She don't want to sing, but that's the words I gave you. Maybe I could get somebody to sing it to you. Maybe Cecil could sing it for you. He was there, I think. All the Indians was there. Gilbert Kauley returned from Germany victorious.

(Gilbert who?)

Gilbert Kauley, that's my nephew.

(Did they just make up that song at the time?)

Well, the words they put in there, but that's an old-time victory song that's been used before—the tune. They just put different words in there. Putting his name in there instead of the old-time victory leader. And it's the same tune. Just like you have a new song now, and they have different words, but the same tune as an old song.

(Do you know that tune?)

Little bit--(sings some) I can't sing it for you, I just know part of it. That's all I can sing. Grandmother sang that old time song and put those words in.
