The Medicine Man in those days, well, they went in there you see, and they was ready. When they brought her in there they took her in there, and they doctored her. They doctored her. They try to get her sense back to normal, like she was before. So they got her straighten up. So her mother got so glad, that she just hug her and said that, "From now on daughter you're not going with nobody. From now on." And that's what the mother has told my grandma. And that was a true story. The Kiowa Indian people knows that that was true. True story that was being--brought way back there. And she's the one that was telling us the story. And then from there, they lived there for several more years.

(Could I ask you this one question?) (What was your grandmother's name?)

Altaidl.

(Now she's the girl that got lost and they found her?)

That's the name.

(And that's your grandmother?)

And that's my grandmother.

(Is it your mother's mother?)

That's right.

(Ok, go ahead.)

And so one day they got her straightened up. All right they had the horses and the stuff that they were to give the man that called for the spirit to come. Well, they had horses already ready out there. When it
