You see I have four-fourths blood--Indian. My registration in Washinton proves that I have that. Four-fourths.

(Lincoln: Full blood Indian (Laughs). In other words, he don't have no Spanish. He's got to have a little touch of Spanish!)

(Yeah--how about Old Man Pallie?)

Well, I guess what they went by would be on my father. My father was a full blooded. Full blooded Indian.

(Lincoln: Half Apache and half Kiowa.)

So, I guess that made me full on my father's side, see.

(Lincoln: But you still have some Spanish blood--your mother--)

(Of course, they considered the catives as Indians, I guess--)

Right. Yeah, they give them the full privilege of full blood after they're captured into the tribe.

(Lincoln: Well, that'd make him about three-fourths Indian you know.

His mother was half.)

#### HOW OLD MAN PALLIE WAS CAPTURED AND ADOPTED BY COMANCHES:

(Do you know any more stories about Old Man Pallie? How they captured him?)

(Lincoln: He knows. The Comanches captured him and later they traded him to the Kiowas.)

You see they sold him to the Kiowa tribe, later. Sold him to the Kiowas.

So then
