always open the door. And when you open the door, they sit down and then he starts to sign and then that woman comes in. She comes in and she (?) up with her bucket and this firemen has a blanket pad--a nice pad--he puts in down in front of the altar. When she comes and puts that bucket down--water--then that blanket, pad put down there, and then she sits down. We finish that. Then she has a comb case--what we call a toilet Indian-case, beaded. Case with comb, brush, looking glass, towel-two or three towels, napkins to wipe their face with, and a little paint if they want it--anybody want to paint their face. She always has that on her left side. Then when the prayer is made, the smoke's made--the chief smokes with his drummer and this cedar man--
