## BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT

Jess Rowlodge is between 82 and 84 years old and is a well-known and respected leader among the Arapahoes. He is fairly well educated and articulate, and has travelled extensively on tribal business, having visited Washington, D.C. a number of times. He has been active in tribal politics for many years and has helped the Arapahoes in pressing their claims cases against the government. Nevertheless, Jess is well-versed in the traditional culture of his tribe and amxious for at least some parts of it to be preserved. He is one of the two surviving members of the StarHawk Society, one of the old age-graded warrior societies, and he has often expressed hope that this organization would be revived in moder times. He is a psyotist, as well as a member of the Baptist Church, and feels that the psyote ceremony has given him some of his greatest personal fulfillment as well as inspiration. Jess is no stranger to the role of teacher-informant in comminicating knowledge about Arapaho culture. He has known and worked with such people as A. L. Kreeber, James Mocney, Morris Smith, Sister Inez Hilger, and Fred Eggan. Mr. Rowlodge was born in 1884.
