They talk to all the people and they said, "Don't surrender. I stop the war, all that." Fort Sill man name Custer, his friend. He the one give him job to go get the other Indians way down (unintelligible place name? some where. Half - - about half camping there. Sixty or seventy camps at that. They gave him lot of white flag. They gave horses, stock - - Custer, took some horse, stock, to send him up there. Way up there. They all bring 'em back. He stop the war, Big Bow. That's a Big Bow story. Fort Sill people know about that. They got record up there Fort Sill.

(Kiowa conversation)

Big Bow story yet. Before the war stop, after they bring Indian - - way out to New Mexico somewhere - - they all bring us back Fort Sill. Then
