Her mother got the - - they check him off two girls - - (Unintelligible phrases and Kiowa words) Lucy's mother and another one - - And get rations too. We give you rations. That's Big Bow story.

(Kiowa conversation)

That's way back. My grandma, they tell story for us, that time. They all tell us (about) Sain day, you know. And way back when I was young - - 'bout fourteen or fifteen years old, the medicine man, they put up the tipi nighttime. Everybody going up there. They gonna get deers. They gonna get deer toward sun-up. They going come up there. People outside - - woman - - stand up and hold like that - - got hatchet and got rope (robe) - stand way off. When the sun come up that medicine man get up. Stand up there toward the sun come up - - the deer come. Deer just a-piling up, a-piling around the tipi, and he said, "Go ahead and catch four." (Unintelligible phrase.) He caught four. My grandma caught four. He didn't shtto the gun - - that medicine done it. They got medicine. And he got four. "Well", they said, "All go ahead and kill it." And one of them, they talk Indian - - deer. He sing, he said, "I'm not worry for my boy, I worry for my son (Unintelligible words) - - I got my boy here, big deer. I cry for my boy." And he said, "Turn that deer up there and got little one - - turn him out." That's the story. That's real story. That's all.

(Is that what your grandmother told you?)

My grandmother name do.bedai Yeah, she tell me story, my grandmother, do.bedai (Charlie:: They were starving, you know, and this man told 'em that We're going to make medicine. So they made this medicine. And they put a big old something, you know, that they had water in, and they were boiling it, you know some fun or something. and that's how - - They said this one spoke
