That's why when the Plains Indians were called to go to Fort Reno--see, they promised them food and clothing and everything--it was wintertime--that's why they hesitated. Because they said, "They lie to you. They cheat you." See, it learned them a lesson when they gave the Cheyennes a white flag and the American flag. They showed them. They already proved to them that they were cheaters. They didn't live up to their promise, and that's what these men said. "No," they said, "We can't trust them."
