Lou Ella: I don't know what they give them. Their mouth dry you know, I guess and they give them something, but they spit it out, they don't swallow it. And after when four days over, they bring the stuff in for them to eat, you know, they eat..and these are not Kiowas, they Cheyennes, you know. I been in there. When they bring them food in there, breakfast food, they big pans..something got cloth over it. They brought it and set it where the drummers where, you know. And when they passing it out, one man he don't allow he said, "No, I don't eat them. My daddy don't allow for me to eat it." And they were little puppies. It's lthem little puppies when they pass it around. They give it to them that dance not the others but I seen in and it was little puppies because the feet sticking out. They got them and they enjoy eating..them Cheyennes you know. They sure like it. And they came in after when it's over, eating, they come in on horses, on four horses. They ride them. Two mens was riding and they give them away, youknow, to some other people. To the Kiowas you know.

SCHOOL EXPERIENCES:

Let's see...I'm going to tell you about when I first start to school. When I was years old, my mother died when I was born I guess and my mama's sister raised me and they put me in school when I was 5 years old. And there's a man there called Martinez Andrew Martinez, he was captured by Kiowas, you know, and he's working in there, and he always talk to me. There's a lot of kids there. Let's see..there's a preacher there named J.J. Mevin. There's a church down here preach to us. I don't understand no English, I just sit down and look. But there's one girl who help but she don't tell me, and I don't understand English tall. I went back to school..a vacation. I went home and I came back, then
