(That wouldn't be Apache John, would it?)

Charlie: Well, you know. We were setting down, and this old lady, Old Lady
Two-Hatchet -- that's the old one - -. She Kiowa. We was sitting down eating
you know, and I was gonna play. I was in a hurry. Mother said, "You all hurry
up and eat, But don't go behind grandma when she's eating meat." You ask
any Indian and he'll tell you - - If he's right, he'll tell you the truth. Said
"Don't get behind her. Because, if something happen - - So I got through
eating. And I was in a hurry and I run back there, you know, and when I run
back there something just throwed me like that. That was all. I didn't
know nothing. So my mother - picked up a shawl - - that's what they like,
you know - - and just put it on her. She said, "Oh, she said, "I'm sorry the
way this happened." In Kiowa. And she turned around and they got me up
there and she blowed on me and worked on me and I come to. And next time
I never do that anymore. That's right. This old lady, whenever any of us get
sick or anything, we go after her. Or we go after this Johnny @ What you call
him?

(*pache John?)

Charlie: Yeah. We go get him, or we go get Little Joe or we get Old Man Ahtone. Jim Ahtone. We get him. I know all them boys. My dad, right up here-
