picture in, photograph you know, in the paper where people would know that he was a real fullblood Indian and going to preach there and that way he draw crowds. And that's the way, through his hair probably, the Lord wouldn't let him through that to save peoples. And right up today, people still talk about him, everywhere. Everywhere I go, they ask me - - When I tell them my name's Neido, well, they -- "Yeah," they waid, "We heard about your dad," back in Omaha, back in Wyoming, back in Blackfoot, Idaho, and in Nevada, he's known over there. So he was pretty well known man. He was know from coast to coast.

(Had he been a peyote man before he - -)

Yeah, he was a peyote man.

(Was he a peyote man the same time he was preaching?)

NO..No, he just change completely. Because he said he found in the Bible that
the Lord said that "Do not put any GOD before me. I am a jealous God." And he
had that. And he went according to that scripture. So all the scripture that
he learned, he lived by that. And then he's not a preacher that would go to
these places like this -- Pow-wow and take part in it. He'll go there, probably
invite
they might with him there, but he go and preach to them, and then after he gets
through, he go his way. So, that's the way he lived.

JOEY TILKS ABOUT BITTING A PEYOTE MEMBER

(You were one of his early converts?)

Yeah. I was his first one.

(But now you're a peyote man?)

Sort of plain speaking English way, I stepped on banana peeling. I slide and I fell. You understand what I'm talking about. I haven't got up yet, but yet I never quit praying. And still, I still remember the Lord is my maker. I've - I pray every day, every night in silence. In my mind I ask the Lord to forgive me for the things that I done throughout the day before I go to sleep. Or, if I die while I'm yet asleep after I done asking the Lord to forgive, the Lord might
