If I don't talk loud enought where you can hear me, well move up closer cause I want all of you all to hear what I got to say to bou/ I kinda made a special trip to come down here this evening. Qфurse on the other hand, I'm not sorry cause I got to roast wome weenien. So as Alfred says this concerns every Kiowa, Comanche, and Apache. I don't care how young or old he is, wherever he might befor whoever he might be. $f$ don't care--this concerns him and this also. cohderns all of us who have been lookin' forward to something that is good. You'll remember the last per capita payment from the claim we won I think everybody reall appreciated it. Gettin' $\$ 194$. Well this time we'He in in ine tp get more than that.

It's even possible we might get doublel back. It looks that good. Last Saturday when wehad this meeting at Andarko bur claim attorney was her\&. He gave us a report--give us a status of our claim, and it's very encouragin'. He said this. This last Saturday before this week is out we will know how much the government is going to offer us. Remember the first two clains we had pending envolove /afot of money. It involves our money. Money that the government misused and mispent, when they shold of done it a little bit better. So that's mgre/or less the claim. All right, now
