"I sent for the drum--the boys want to sing a little bit. And I think we got everything underway on this trip to Walters. So I'm going to Carnegie tomorrow to talk to some more people. See if we can make it down there. That's, Saturday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday, pow-wow at Walters. Tomorrow I'm going to go see some people, see if I can get 'em down there. So I let Philemon take over on what's really important to Kiowas, Comanches, and Apaches. So Philemon go ahead-- "

TALK TO BLACKFOOT GROUP ON APACHE TRIBAL BUSINESS:

If I don't talk loud enought where you can hear me / we'll move up closer cause I want all of you all to hear what I got to say to bou. made a special trip to come down here this evening. Course on the other hand, I'm not sorry cause I got to roast wome weenies. So as Alfred says this concerns every Kiowa, Comanche, and Apache. I don't care how young or old he is, wherever he might be or whoever he might be. f don't care--this concerns him and this also concerns all of us who have been lookin' forward to something that is good. You'll memember the last per capita payment from the claim we won I think everybody reall appreciated it. Gettin' \$194. Well this time we' #e in line to get more than that. It's even possible we might bet double back. It looks that good. Last Saturday when wehad this meeting at Anadarko our claim attorney was hhere. He gave us a report -- give us a status of our claim, and it's very encouragin'. He said this. This last Saturday before this week is out we will know how much the government is going to offer us. Remember the first two claims we had pending envolve alot of money. It involves our money. Money that the government misused and mispent, when they should of done it a little bit better. So that's more or less the claim. All right, now
