However, we need some backing. I'm not just talking for the Apache but also the Kiowas and Comanches. Also all right, our lawyers told us Saturday how important it was for us to have a government important to have a committee so that when we ~~were~~ ready to present a bill to office this payment we must send a delegation to Washington to tell them how we want this money. All right there's not nobody here this evening or anywhere who does not favor a per capita payment I think that's one thing we all agree on. I don't think there's anyone who says I don't want a per capita payment. I believe everybody does. It's not going to be easy unless you aet right in here an fight this thing to. We have to convience the BIA and we have to convicne Congress on how we want this money. Right now some tribes are having a little difficulty on how they are gonna get their money. But in one way ~~te~~ they have an advantage. They have a committee that is going to battle for them. We don't have. That's what Miscowsky said Saturday when we got through with the meeting. We were walking down the hall, he told me, Apaches needed a tribal government. We need a committee so that we know how we can work with and also who congress will be able to work with. He knows we don't have anything like that and that's what he wants. So he ought to know we ought to have thatmuch confidenece in our claims attorney
