Ed Nix was born in 1893 in Pottawatomie County, Indian Territory. They moved to the Chickasaw Nation in 1898 and to Chickasha, Oklahoma in 1899. He moved to Caddo County in 1902 and has lived near Carnegie since that time. Mr. Nix is a veteran of World War I. He was superintendent of the Water Department in Carnegie for forth years and retired five years ago.
