This cedar is different from these, the one she doctors with. It's got to be a certain kind and that's what she--they say it grows on top of Mt. Scott.

(Did you ever know her mother or her uncle?)

Yeah, she told me that Wayne White Wolf gave her that medicine, showed her how to use it, and told her to keep a black handkerchief around her neck all the time. But she thought it was silly, she took it off.

She just lost it, she said. I told her I said, "Well, if he toll you to keep it on why don't you keep it on it don't make no difference what people say, just keep it on around your neck like he told you." And so her uncle gave her that medicine she told me. I know her mama and dad too. They Christian peoples.

(I know a Kiowa man named James Houmpy who wears that black handkerchief around his neck.)

Oh.

(He said his grandfather told him to do that. He still got it.)

I told Mary, "You should have it on," I say.
