BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

Abe Grad is 74 years of age. He came to Carnegie in 1911, from Poland when he was 18 years of age to work for his cousins in the Dixie Store in Carnegie. He became a naturalized citizen after six years and joined to army and served overseas in World War I. Mr. Grad has lived in Carnegie 55 years because he saus he didn't think he would find a better place to live. He has always been associated with Indians since coming here, in and out of business and has a very high regard for them.
