gon, there wash't any poke grown in oregon. Now, that's another one, poke is medicine if you know how to use it.

· (Poke?

Oh, yes. You better believe it. You know roots from that poke will cure ringworms and the green walnut hull out there will cure ringworms.

Oh, I know lot of doctors tell you it won't but I know better. One time some people brought some cats on our place when I'se a little kid, you know dumped whole bunch of them. And they had ringworm and us kids got 'em. Boy, my mama got a lot of green walnuts and took the hulls and crushed 'em up and boiled 'em and then she put us in that water. It liked to killed us. I burnt like fire. But we got rid of the ringworms. And it colored us. We were brown kids for a while, you know.

WHITE CAPTIVES:

That's the way the Indians used to when they'd steal white kids and if they'd have black hair. They'd take the walnut and hickory nut hulls, pecan hulls, green ones, crush 'em all up. You didn't know that did you? Oh yeah. Did you know that when they found, you know, accepted the fact that they were defeated that so called wise people, you know, that thought ahead, you know that they couldn't drive out the white people, that the men that were little so called wise people, you know, that thought ahead. They gathered from all different tribes from all over the United States. They worked out a plan where they'd steal these white people. I used to have a Sunday School teacher was stole by the Indians and they worked out a family, they'd steal these women, young girls and then their kids would be—have the same thought want to be educated, see? They made a plan where they'd steal a thousand or so many or you know. I don't think they counted the numbers like we
