Kiowas and the Comanches have that. They tell story about a certain guy that had power. But when they partake of this, the peyote takes over and thier power don't count, like I said, I got education, but when I go in there this education don't go howheres. It don't have nothing to do with peyote.

(Could you tell about any particular things that happened in there when they were trying to show their power?)

Yeah. That's like this fellow they call Saddleblanket. He had power too. He been trying it in there. But one time, I guess, he overdosed himself with this peyote, and boy, he was pitiful. His hair come down and he sat there and he had no power. You've felt that way some time—you'just feel like you want to slump over but yet you retain your—you keep in contact with your mind. You don't lose your mind. But some people just let it go, and that's where you go haywire—run amuck or—but nowdays, usually, you go "buys". Well that's—those terms—there's various terms—to explain that feeling. And another word they use—"hablucinations." Well, is that similar to sanity"?

(No, It's more like seeing visions, or something like that.)

(Yes. Seeing things that aren't there.)

It has nothing to do with LSD?

(Well, it could. Some people say when you take LSD you see things and they would call these things hallucinations. "Hallucination" is just used for anytime you think you see something that's not really there. Then they say that's a hallucination. Like if I'd say, to you right now, there's a black cat on the bed-you; ight be thinking I was having a hallucination, because you couldn't see it. It would be in
