Well, I seen some old fans, you know. Old man had some yellowhammer feathers, and some falcon feathers I think they call it. They come from the north. (That's your dad?)

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Yeah. Them old fans, there's still some around, but the bead work is different from today. And the beads are different. That's where I picked it up. (Did your dad make fans too?)

Yeah, way back there.

(Did he go to Native American Church services?) Yeah.

SOME EARLY PEYOTISTS

(Was he a leader too? Like you are?)

I don't know. I don't know if he ever conduct meetings or not. But one of my great-grandpa that used to live at Mt. Scott. That's where they had meeting all the time.

(Who was that?)

They call him let's see, Pa ga togodl

(Would you say that again?)

pagatogodl

(That was your great-grandfather?) Yeah. He used to conduct meetings, and the old man, he carry drum for him.

(Your dad?)

Um-hum. Every time they had meeting they just call him over and he carry drum. That's at Mt. Scott. That's when that peyote was, just beginning way back, I don't know what year. But it come from that way--Wichita Mountains. Yeah, that peyote.

(I'd like to talk to you about that, but I'd like to have a whale tape on the history of the peyote and what it meant to the Indians, so I don't think I'll

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
