Yeah. His name is Guy Stump. He comes from Marieta, Kansas. Then after that I got to running around here and he'd tell me that he'd haul his lumber from Caldwell, Kansas, this house.

(To build this house here?)

Um-hum. It's got these square headed nails, they called horse shoe nails. And it's built out of all that lumber that they brought from Caldwell, Kansas. And what's holding it up now is the partitions. It's that porch.

(When was it built about 1800 and, was it about 1880?)

Yeah, that's what he said. He claims it's about--it's a good 100 years old.

(It's getting close to it.)

Then I left from here and I got with the white people. I strayed away from here and my Indian ways.

(Most of your younger life you were around white people?)

Um-hum, yeah. I left here in 1922. So I was away from here. Just what I read and what I pick up, is what I learn about my ancestors. And we got a creek down there west of Denver, Colorado. They call Left Hand Creek. And they got a town over there called Nawas, Colorado. That's from, pronounce it Left Hand too. His name, boy name, got to be boyhood, well grandpa Left Hand his name was Nawas and that's way--so that way they call claim they different places where Left Hand's been.

(Where Left Hands been and family?)

Yeah. so that's--
