it didn't seem to me they did course now to me it seems like a contradiction people needed roads down there they maybe have one good farm to market road but they didn't start building WPA came along. they got all inds of roads around the la eg for fishing and a few hill folks that are left down there are enjoying those but it seemed like caterin' the people that feally needed it didn't get it. So this was a result of the white -- people. Most of the people out o Stading Rock Bend at one time lifed in -- County Arkansas talked about the country and they sit back there and then Carter's of course came from Tennessee But many sit back -- many of them intermarried with the Chero'ee's. And quite a number of hills folis did, in fact even when I was see, in '49 I moved into Muslogee and still served in Taklequah for eight, years. Sunday afternoons or nights -still held services over there. And quite a number of my congregattion are Checkee. They were well accepted in fact the Chero ee's had made a real contributaion to Muskogee. I was invited bout a year . ago after 'D gave thesethings to Dr. -- these Indian artifacts why I'm supposed to become a member of the Cherokee of the Five Civilized Tribes, who aponsored that course they had quite a museum on top of Captial Mill, in Muskogee Heights near the Verteran's Hospital was part of the job in Muskogee too. Served veterans and I appreciate that kind of work, always did line institutional work and I kinda Mad the secret ambition that if I live that long1 of retiring to be an instituonomen pastor in Tulsa

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
