They don't care, how or what - they don't care if they did get shot. They go ahead and fight anyway. And some of them I know, one man got shot on the chest. And when he breathing the blood just coming out, shooting out. And they take and he fight, they take him away, they take him back. They want him to stop, so they take him back. He don't want it. He says, "I'm alright, I'm alright. I don't want to die out there in camp, I want to die in the battle field. That's what I want." And he knows that he's going to die, but they won't stop. They just kept that way. So finally they just take him back to the camp and he holler and holler and he says, "Let me go let me go and fight." He just holler and close to morning he quite hollering and finally he died that night. Then when the little, the camp when they start fighting out there, and there's little boy, he's little boy, maybe about 3 years old, something like that. They captured with some other Indians, Yaqui Indians captured - they catch this boy, but they said he's too little to take him so they knock him in the head with a gun. They kill it right there. Then they went on. These Apache prisoners they told this story. When they on their way somewhere. These Apaches went over there and attack these Yaqui Indians. That's the time that one woman, when they shooting, one woman was captured. Soon as she hear the gun she just fall right down in there. She didn't get shot but she act like she got shot. That a way she was safe. After everybody, all the Yaqui Indians passed, why she run back. She's the one that told the story about that little boy. Then the boy went down there and try to find something to eat. Just about two days they went back and found that boy. And still living yet. And then they just kept going. They move way up in other places. Other places they try to fight, but another place where the Mexicans when they goes in there. Goes in the
