Uh-huh.

(They just--well it's kind of sad sometimes, isn't it to see it happen?)

Oh yeah, I got--and my uncle's daughter, all she does is drink wine, day after day, night after night. I think that's something-
(Haven't_anything else to do?)

I pray, you know, wish and pray that they would close these liquor stores, but I guess they won't ever be--

(No, not anymore.)

Now seems like they try to bring this saloon back into-(Trying to aren't they?)

Yeah. It'd be worse. As it is our boys are just trying to shoot one anothere, out here you know.

(Get drunk and fight and shoot--)

There sure be a lot of Indians dead .-

(That's awful. Let me--I want to get your name and address I'd the to come, back up and visit sometime if you'd like, if you don't mi.d?)

No, I den't mind:

(Because there's so much of the things that you know and talk about, that all these others will be gone one of these days, and young people don't seem
