(Well, I've enjoyed this brief visit, maybe I could come back in a couple of weeks and visit some more sometime. I'm going to come up Monday night at this meeting, at the library in the basement. I'm going to see what this legal aid man is, because these people up here need some legal help.)

Yeah, they do.

They're mistreated, too, in many ways.)
