It's just like I say, you get a group of leaders that's, there was a group of leaders, it's the group of leaders that's looking forward toward something. In other words, they figure a better way, maybe this is the way we should live, or this is the way we should attain what we want. Course it takes education. But I mean this, by leaders, there can be a leader, the one that thinks about the people and want to do something for them. And the way he thinks about this leadership, I think is that he looks for these opportunities. Maybe he's involved in these, and he passes them back to his people. This is the only way you're going to do it, by taking advantage of these things or education or things is gonna be different five years, ten years from now. But then you got some leaders. They stick to the old tradition ways, and they carry them on, which is good, I don't say that it's wrong, but they never go beyond that. It's all the same, year after year, it's gonna be the same year after year. Like I say, in every community you got leaders that's trying to advance to something, then you got leaders that don't want to go any farther. And people sometimes look at them and say, "Well, here's a great leader here," well, then they overlook somebody that's really trying to do something. Well, we gonna have to do this. In other words, when I say communication, somewhere, we're missing something to, we're not thinking the same way. Here we're divided in groups, we want to follow this other one and these other ones want to follow other one.
