Yeah, for instance, you take their lunch room, where they eat. Indian never realizes, he knows that they eat over there and they got to pay so much to eat, and why you can't eat for nothing over there. But they don't dig back far enough to say where does that money come from they buy their food, somebody. They don't think, now somebody has to pay for that food. And the last four years now, we've, this adult education has helped them. They have donated \$175 each year to help with food. All right, he comes back and the Indian wants to say, all right, how come mine's not eating for nothing. You pay for other guys, you know. We try to pick the ones that's really needs the help. But, I said if they would realize better this way. Say, well, we just go to school and lay it on the principal's desk and say here's \$175 we want to donate it to the lunchroom. That principal says I'll never let Indian boys go away hungry. If he's got not money, he's gonna eat. Lot of time, maybe that's the only time he gets to eat. We're not going to send him away. We are allotted so much money a year, make it last nine months. If the
