(Bob reads John 14 in Choctaw.)

(You read the first six verses of the 14 Chapter of John. Was there when the roll-Choctaw roll was made up where was your mother and dad on it?)

Roll?

(mh-hum.)

What roll number? Yeah. That's when they--my mother and my dddy all we come up here you know, I got a daddy and a mother, too. And we all come up here.

(What's your roll number?)

1010

(1010. 1010 and yours is 6755.)

(6755)

(6755. What's yours? Do you remember?)

10335, 10334.

(Did you have brothers and sisters?)

All of them?

(Any of them go to Indian schools?)

Huh-hu. No, no school here when we came to this country in 1903. Ain't nothin but the turkeys, deer.

(Wudn't any public schools till after statehood in 1906?) Any place to fish?)

Fish? In the river. Blue.

(We moved from Kansas down here in 1902.)
