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(Would you--other than your Indian land and that short time you spent at an
 'Indian school -- have you had any help from the government, anyway?)'
 Oh, T jest I get a little old age check assistance and I get some Social Scurity.
 I don't get much outa neither one.
 (And that's not cause you're Indian?)
 No.
 (No/ Were you ever in the service?)
 Never was.
 (Néver was.) .
 I was rejected.
 (Would you have been old enough?)
Yes, I was called up in the First WorlddWar.
 (What do you think about the Indian boys who've been in the service, and who get
to go to school. We;ve probably had more Indians through college you know because
 they-o)
Well, I wouldn't know what to tell you about that.
(Any more, you know, most of the Indian Mids don't go to Indian schools. They go --)
No, they go to these other schools now. Well, you know they can draw on the Indian
children, you know, extra moneo on them you know and a --
 (The schools do? Uh-huh.)
So much a head, you know. I don't know what it is. I believe it's 10c a day,
 they get on 'em.
 (I'm not sure either.)
 I don't know justwhat it is:
(I know all the time I was in school the school took a roll you know, checked it
the Indian students because they got so much for books. LAnda--)
Well, it was -- for -- I think it's 10c a day. I think that's what it is. Extra.'
That was Indian children. Will, I went to old Goodland you know, there's whites
and Indians all went there you know, they didn't have no school. Whites went there
lbut I've heard theyhad to pay you-
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(Did they live there in the xchool?
