(He also was the grandfather of John Leitka, now, who is a Baptist minister?)

No, he--dat's right--not John Leitka, but John--

(Elliott and Frank?)

Dat's it.

SCHOOL AT NOBLETOWN

(Do you remember--you mentioned earlier that you had gone to school about a year at Nobletown?)

Yes, suh.

(Do you remember who some of the pupils were at that school?)

Oh, God--uhh, uhhh--You mean you want me to call de names of some of 'em?

Well, Ned Alen, Joe Allen, Whistler Noble, Eohn Noble, Harry Cyrus--Oh--Lawd --I know I never would name all of 'em.

(Were they mostly Indian youngsters or colored?)

No, dey was colored.

(All colored?)

Yes suh, dey, but two Indians went to school dere. Dat was old man Captain Larney's boy and daughter. The boy was name--but the girl was name Millie.
