Uh-huh. If I am real sick, I'd go. Ida - she said she would take me to hospital today. But I'm not sick. Just my leg you know, it don't do nothing. But now it's all right.

(Better than it was?)

Uh-huh. And wasp sting me right there. (Laughter)

(When was that?)

Last night.

(Think that had something to do with how your arm feels?)

I have a - that wind is hot and I went - I started to go bed - I start to put that window down and it stung me right in here and after that I can't walk.

(Is there a wasp nest out there?)

No. He said he looked for it - he looked for it all over this morning. She see no wasp there.

(Did you see the wasp?)

I don't know. I know the wasp there. Just plain stung my finger.

(I thought maybe it was a spider. It might have been a spider. Maybe that made you sick. Where are your mother and father buried?)
