(This is the one you were telling us that you remember. That they had started over here at this new lake here which is located about five miles west of Pawnee and about how many miles south? How many miles north? Two miles?)

Mrs. Osborne: Four.

I'd say about ten over here.

(Four miles.)

Mrs. Osborne: Uh huh about ten.

(What was this--you also in talking about this--proving that its medicine that-- that the, the band. I think now if I remember right. You mentioned, you have mentioned that one time that the band was going to go to visit usually collected-- usually met some particular place. And then went as a group.)

Mrs. Osborne: Uh huh.

(What was the meaning of this? Going as a group?)

Uh, that. To answer that--answer that question I think it would mean like this.

That the--when they went as a group. They went on a certain day. And the three men were making preparations in there, to receive them there at the camp ground.

I think that's the reason why they went in a group, 'cause the three men were expecting the Chaui band, on a certain day. Instead of going in one at a time.

They all went together. They build their camp on the same day. The Skidi band were already camped there. And they were going to receive them. In other words welcome.

Mrs. Osborne: And you couldn't go unless the leaders--you know when they all went..

When they cross the stream there. They all had to get off their wagons. And go through a ceremony before they cross that stream of water. So that's why-- maybe reason that's why they had to go in a group.

(Uh huh. What was the meaning of them stopping at all these streams and having these little ceremonies?)
